Observations

CRITERIA FOR GRANTING HONORABLE REGISTRATION: Those students who have obtained a final grade equal to or greater than 9.5 will be eligible for the "Honors" qualification. Given equality of grades between students, given the impossibility of granting a greater number of honors, the percentage of attendance and participation in class will be taken into account. All of this in accordance with the general regulations that indicate that the number of "Honors" mentions that can be awarded may not exceed five percent of the students included in the same official record, unless this is less than 20. in which case a single "Honor Registration" may be granted.

CRITERIA FOR THE FINAL GRADE: It will be necessary to obtain a 5 in the final exam so that the percentages obtained from the marks of the practical part can be applied, as well as those obtained by attendance and participation in class and, thus, obtain the final grade for the subject, which obviously must be equal to or greater than 5.

OBSERVATIONS:

For those students who do not pass the subject in the first call, there may be two cases to pass the subject in the second call:

--- students who, passing the final exam, after adding the 3 evaluable parameters (practices, attendance and final exam) do not reach 5.

--- students who have passed the practices and do not reach 5 on the final exam.

In the first case, students in the second call must take a practical exam that will consist of one or several practical cases to be carried out entirely in writing (which may deal with any of the topics of the practices that have been carried out during the course p e.g. preparation of an expert report on documentary falsification, a graphoscopic expert report, a writing description...). You must get at least a 5 to proceed to the sum of the 3 evaluable parameters (final exam, practical exam and attendance-participation).

The subject will be approved when the total final grade is 5 or higher.

In the second case, in the second call they will take a new multiple choice exam of 50 questions on the theoretical content of the subject, having to get at least a 5 in that exam to proceed to the sum of



the 3 evaluable parameters (final exam, practical exam and attendance-participation). The subject will be approved when the total final grade is 5 or higher.

All of them, if they do not pass the subject in that second call, in an extraordinary call they will be examined in two parts: a first part that will consist of a multiple choice exam of 50 questions on the theoretical content and one or several practical cases to be carried out completed in writing (which may address any of the topics of the practices that have been carried out during the course, for example: preparation of an expert report on documentary falsification, a graphoscopic expert, a description of writing...). To pass the subject and To take the average, it will be necessary to obtain a minimum of 5 points in each of the exams.

MENTION OF DISTINCTION:

According to Article 22 of the Regulations governing the Evaluation and Qualification of UCV Courses, the mention of "Distinction of Honor" may be awarded by the professor responsible for the course to students who have obtained, at least, the qualification of 9 over 10 ("Sobresaliente").
