CRITERIA FOR GRANTING A DISTINCTION OF HONOR:

De conformidad con la normativa reguladora de la evaluación y la calificación de la asignatura vigente en la UCV, la mención de "Matrícula de Honor" podrá ser otorgada a los alumnos que hayan obtenido una calificación igual o superior a 9.0. El número de "Matrículas de Honor" no podrá exceder del cinco por ciento de los alumnos matriculados en el grupo en el correspondiente curso académico, salvo que el número de alumnos matriculados sea inferior a 20, en cuyo caso se podrá conceder una sola "Matrícula de Honor".

De forma excepcional, se podrá asignar las matrículas de honor entre los diferentes grupos de una misma asignatura de manera global. No obstante, el número total de matrículas de honor a conceder será el mismo que si se asignaran por grupo, pero pudiéndose éstas, repartirse entre todos los alumnos en función de un criterio común, sin importar el grupo al que pertenece.

CRITER A FOR GRANTING A DISTINCTION OF HONOR:

At the discretion of the teacher may be granted an honors degree for every 20 students (not for fraction of 20; except for the first 20 students).

MENTION OF DISTINCTION:

According to Article 22 of the Regulations governing the Evaluation and Qualification of UCV Courses, the mention of "Distinction of Honor" may be awarded by the professor responsible for the course to students who have obtained, at least, the qualification of 9 over 10 ("Sobresaliente"). The number of "Distinction of Honor" mentions that may be awarded may not exceed five percent of the number of students included in the same official record, unless this number is lower than 20, in which case only one "Distinction of Honor" may be awarded.

Learning activities

The following methodologies will be used so that the students can achieve the learning outcomes of the subject:

- M1 Presentation of contents by the teacher, analysis of competencies, explanation and demonstration of abilities, skills and knowledge in the classroom.
- M2 Specific instructions about group and individual assignments for each topic.
- M3 Group work sessions supervised by the teacher. Study of legal cases, both real and fictitious, analysis, diagnosis, problems, field study, computer room, visits, data search, libraries, network, Internet, etc. Significant construction of knowledge through student interaction and activity. Critical analysis on values and social commitment.
- M4 Application of interdisciplinary knowledge.
- M5 Supervised monographic sessions with shared participation
- M6 Personalized attention and in small groups. Period of instruction and/or orientation carried out by a tutor with the objective of reviewing and discussing the materials and topics presented in the classes, seminars, readings, completion of assignments, etc.
