Observations

1.- ATTENDANCE

A. Failure to attend 80% of the classes (e.g. 17 out of 22 teaching sessions) implies the loss of the right to attend the exam in the first call (justified or not), and the student must attend the second call directly. And losing the percentage of grade corresponding to attendance and participation.

Since the student can miss 20% of the total classes, excuses for absence are not accepted.

In no case will justifications sent by email, virtual tutoring or message on the platform be taken into account. In exceptional cases, the circumstance must be accredited in person, on the first day the student rejoins class. Never through a platform.

Lack of punctuality at the time of starting class may be considered "absence" attendance, once the attendance control has been passed -orally or by signature- by the teacher.

2.- EVALUATION:

The continuous evaluation will be developed based on the activities proposed in the classroom or on the teaching platform.

The final test may consist of any of these three options: - a multiple choice exercise, - questions developing a topic and/or short answer questions - or an oral exam.

To pass the subject, the student must, in addition to meeting the attendance requirement (at least 80%, justified or not), have separately passed the different evaluation systems: -Active participation, personal work and practices (20%); - Group work (20%) - And the objective test or exam (60%).

The detection of plagiarism or AI text transcription in any of the works will result in a grade of 0 for the exercise.

Under no circumstances is the delivery of tasks outside the deadline or time established on the platform permitted. Those sent by email, virtual tutoring or message on the platform will not be evaluable.

The grades obtained will be valid for only one academic year, therefore in the event of failing the



subject, the grade for any of the evaluation instruments will not be saved in the second enrollment or in subsequent calls.

3.- GRANTING OF HONORABLE REGISTRATION:

The mention of "Honors" may only be awarded to students who have demonstrated levels of excellence in all skills and learning outcomes, provided that they have demonstrated a manifest interest in the subject, actively participated in the teaching sessions, attending personal tutoring and carried out complementary tasks to expand or deepen the topics (readings, writing dissertations, essays, etc.). And they have obtained at least a grade equal to or greater than 9.0. The number of "Honors" may not exceed 5% of the students enrolled in the group in the corresponding academic year, unless the number of students enrolled is less than 20, in which case a single "Honors" may be granted. Honor".

The criteria for granting "Honors" will be carried out according to the criteria stipulated by the teacher responsible for the subject detailed in the "Observations" section of the evaluation system of the teaching guide.

EVALUACIÓN

La evaluación continua se desarrollará en base a las actividades que se propongan en el aula o en la plataforma docente

Criterio de concesión de MATRICULA DE HONOR:

La mención de "Matrícula de Honor" sólo podrá ser otorgada a los alumnos que hayan evidenciado **niveles de excelencia en todas las competencias y resultados de aprendizaje, se hayan destacado en su interés por profundizar en la materia participando en clase, solicitando lecturas complementarias, realizando trabajos extraordinarios, frecuentando las tutorías presenciales, etc.** y hayan obtenido al menos una calificación igual o superior a 9.0.

In accordance with the regulations governing the assessment and grading of subjects in force at UCV, the distinction of "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may be awarded to students who have achieved a grade of 9.0 or higher. The number of "Matrículas de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may not exceed five percent of the students enrolled in the group for the corresponding academic year, unless the number of enrolled students is fewer than 20, in which case a single "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may be awarded.

Exceptionally, these distinctions may be assigned globally across different groups of the same subject. Nevertheless, the total number of distinctions awarded will be the same as if they were assigned by group, but they may be distributed among all students based on a common criterion, regardless of the group to which they belong. The criteria for awarding "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) will be determined according to the guidelines stipulated by the professor responsible for the course, as detailed in the "Observations" section of the evaluation system in the course guide.

Learning activities

The following methodologies will be used so that the students can achieve the learning outcomes of the subject:

- M1 Teacher presentation of contents, competency analysis, explanation and demonstration of capacities, abilities and knowledge in the classroom (presential modality).



- M2 Teacher-supervised groupwork sessions: case studies, diagnostic tests, problems, fieldwork, IT room, visits, data searches, libraries, web, Internet, etc. Building knowledge significantly through interaction and student activities (presential modality).
- M4 Application of interdisciplinary knowledge.
- M6 Personalized attention in small groups. Training and/or orientation period by a teacher aimed at revising and discussing the materials and topics presented in the lessons, seminars, lectures, assignments, etc.
- M7 Set of oral and/or written tests employed in initial, training or summative assessment of the student.
- M8 Group preparation of readings, essays, problem resolution, seminars, assignments, reports, etc. to be presented or handed in during theory lessons, practical lessons and/or tutoring sessions in small groups. Tasks done on the platform or other virtual spaces.
